Liz Goldsmith received a B.A. in Biology from Macalester College in 2007. She worked for several years in Alaska and the upper Midwest as a seasonal wildlife technician prior to moving to Fairbanks, Alaska in 2010. Her wildlife work sparked her interest in wildlife diseases, which led to an interest in a career in veterinary public health. While completing pre-veterinary coursework at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, Liz worked on a research project examining the association between fox population genetics and rabies distribution in Alaska, and she worked for the Alaska Department of Fish and Game as the Wildlife Veterinary Services Intern. Liz began the DVM-MPH combined degree program at Colorado State University and Colorado School of Public Health in 2013. She is currently a first year veterinary student in the College of Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences at CSU and is working towards completing her MPH research with Alaska Department of Fish and Game Wildlife Veterinary Services focusing on brucellosis in Alaskan wildlife.
