Your investment in AAVLD is paying off!

New funding of over \$800,000, to be distributed among AAVLD laboratories in the National Animal Health Laboratory Network (NAHLN), has come about in 2014 in large part as a result of AAVLD's lobbying efforts over the last several years. Those lobbying efforts resulted in increasing USDA-NIFA funding to \$6.7M for the Food and Agricultural Defense Initiative (FADI), which provides infrastructure support to many NAHLN laboratories. The new FADI funding plus partnering by USDA-NIFA and USDA-APHIS resulted in the significant increases in infrastructure support seen in 2014 for both NAHLN Core and NAHLN Member laboratories across the country.

For the past 4 years, members of the AAVLD Executive Board, AAVLD Government Relations Committee, and AAVLD-USAHA Joint Committee on the NAHLN have made many 'storming the Hill' visits in Washington, DC, meeting with key Representatives and Senators on both sides of the aisle in an effort to increase NAHLN support and increase the visibility for the importance of animal health surveillance across the country by the NAHLN. With the guidance and constant attention of AAVLD's lobbyist, Brad Mollet of Capitol Counsel in Washington, DC, that effort is beginning to pay off in real dollars to NAHLN laboratories as indicated by the increased funding realized this year. In addition, those same lobbying efforts resulted in authorization of \$15M for the NAHLN in the recently passed 2014 Farm Bill for which appropriation decisions are currently ongoing on Capitol Hill.

This effort to increase NAHLN visibility and funding has also been made possible by the critical support of many organizations AAVLD interacts with in efforts that benefit many animal industries. Thanks Thomas McKenna, Immediate Past President

CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

57th Annual AAVLD Meeting October 16 - 21, 2014 Crown Center Sheraton Hotel and Convention Center Kansas City, MO Note: NEW this year laboratory staff are encouraged to apply for 3 AAVLD Foundation STAFF TRAVEL AWARDS! Trainees are also encouraged to apply for up to 12 Student Trainee Travel Awards.

The AAVLD is soliciting applications for the following AAVLD Awards:

<u>AAVLD Trainee Travel Awards:</u> Trainees in a Master's, PhD or residency program enrolled in all disciplines in veterinary diagnostic medicine are encouraged to apply, including epidemiology, immunology, microbiology (bacteriology, food safety, mycology and virology), molecular diagnostics, parasitology, pathology, and toxicology.

The \$1,500 travel awards are intended to help defray the cost of travel and lodging to attend the Annual AAVLD meeting. The Trainee Travel Awards are funded by the AAVLD Foundation, and are intended to fulfill the recruitment and education mission of the AAVLD Foundation by encouraging trainee excellence in their diagnostic discipline, developing trainee presentation skills (verbal, written, organizational), and promoting networking of trainees with veterinary laboratory diagnosticians. This year, funds are available for up to 12 travel awards.

<u>AAVLD Laboratory Staff Travel Awards</u>: Veterinary diagnostic laboratory staff in any discipline are encouraged to apply, including epidemiology, immunology, microbiology (bacteriology, food safety, mycology and virology), molecular diagnostics, parasitology, pathology, and toxicology.

The \$1,500 travel awards are intended to help defray the cost of travel and lodging to attend the AAVLD Annual Meeting. The Laboratory Staff Travel Awards are funded by the AAVLD Foundation and are new for 2014. Laboratory staff travel to the AAVLD Annual Meeting is intended to encourage laboratory staff excellence in their diagnostic discipline, promote networking of veterinary laboratorians, and encourage participation in AAVLD committees. This year, funds are available for up to 3 laboratory staff travel awards.

<u>AAVLD Graduate Student Presentations Awards</u> (oral and poster presentations): The AAVLD encourages trainees in all disciplines of veterinary diagnostic medicine to apply. Veterinary diagnostic disciplines include epidemiology, immunology, microbiology (bacteriology, food safety, mycology and virology), molecular diagnostics, parasitology, pathology, and toxicology. The purpose of the awards is to encourage trainee excellence in their diagnostic discipline and to develop trainee presentation skills (verbal, written,

organizational).

Two awards will be selected and given during the 2014 AAVLD Annual Meeting in Kansas City, MO, one for best oral presentation and one for best poster presentation. The recipient of each award will receive a \$500 cash prize. The AAVLD Awards Committee will select the awardees and awardees will be announced during the joint AAVLD/USAHA President's Reception and Dinner during the annual meeting.

Students: The AAVLD and the American College of Veterinary Pathologists (ACVP) encourage trainees in veterinary pathology to participate in the annual meetings of both organizations. The AAVLD/ACVP Diagnostic Pathology Award for Residents/Graduate Students will be presented to graduate students and/or veterinary pathology residents for the best oral presentation in the field of

veterinary pathology at the annual AAVLD meeting in Kansas City, MO. The purpose of the award is to support travel of the award winner to the next annual ACVP meeting to present the award-winning presentation at the ACVP meeting. AAVLD 57th Annual Meeting Diagnostic Pathology Slide Seminar October 16-22 2014, Kansas City, Missouri Submission Deadline: July 1, 2014

Anatomic and clinical pathologists are invited to submit cases for the Diagnostic Pathology Slide Seminar at the 2014 AAVLD meeting. Necropsy, surgical pathology, or cytology cases that presented a diagnostic challenge or represent an emerging disease entity are solicited. Graduate students and residents are encouraged to present.

Presentations are 5 minutes in length, with another 4 minutes for discussion. Abstracts should be submitted electronically to Dr Tim Cushing by July 1, 2014. Cases are reviewed as submitted; case submission will close early if presentation slots (16) are filled.

Style and format: Only one page per abstract please. Please use one inch margins, Times New Roman 11 pt font, center and bold title, center authors (full first name and last name) and affiliations below the title, bold presenter's name. Previous year's abstracts are available on the AAVLD annual meeting page for use as an example.

Presenters of accepted abstracts must supply a set of 65 H&E glass slides for necropsy and surgical pathology cases. Cytology cases should consist of as many glass slides as are available and if less than 65 slides then a series of high quality digital images that are representative of the case. Case materialshould be submitted to Dr. Rob Bildfell by September 1, 2014 to allow for distribution and review of slides by attendees before the meeting.

Presenters and their sponsoring laboratory will receive a set of slides at no charge. The additional slide sets will be available, on a first comefirst serve basis, for a \$50 donation to the Pathology travel fund of the AAVLD Foundation. A few slide sets from 2011, 2012 and 2013 conferences are still available for purchase. Please contact Dr. Rob Bildfell if you are interested.

All submissions will presented as abstracts, the Program Committee will select some abstracts to also be presented as 15 minute oral presentations. Authors will be notified of acceptance decisions by **July 15, 2014.**

Instructions for authors

- 1. Only narrative type abstracts will be accepted. Do NOT use headings (i.e. Introduction, Materials and methods, Results, Discussion and conclusion, etc.) for individual sections.
- 2. Abstract length is restricted to 3000 characters, about 400 words.
- 3. Submit abstracts as word processing documents attached to the email.
- 4. Abstracts must be accurate and in the complete and final version (edited for grammar and spelling) before submission.
- 5. Addition of up to 3 references from <u>peer-reviewed</u> literature, as well as indication of sources and manufacturers of products are possible, but need to be considered within the 400-word limit. Style for quotation and references needs to follow *Journal of Veterinary Diagnostic Investigation* guidelines.
